

This map represents a portion of the Round 3 marine protected area (MPA) proposal developed by the MLPA North Coast Regional Stakeholder Group (NCRSG) for consideration by the MLPA Blue Ribbon Task Force. The MPAs are shown in geographic clusters and include the proposed commercial and recreational uses as well as the proposed recreational uses intended to accommodate tribes and tribal communities. Tribal uses were developed based on input from California north coast tribes and tribal communities. The NCRSG also developed a special closures recommendation; the special closures are a separate recommendation from the Round 3 NCRSG MPA Proposal. 

2. The recreational take, intended to accommodate tribal uses, of:
 - rockfish, cabezon, sculpin, lingcod, greenling, California halibut, Pacific halibut, redbait surfperch, other surfperch, salmon, stickleback (HOOK AND LINE);
 - Pacific lamprey (SPEARFISHING OR BOW AND ARROW);
 - shiner surfperch, surf smelt, anchovy and herring (DIP NET OR CAST NET);
 - eulachon (DIP NET);
 - octopus and bay ghost shrimp (HAND);
 - anchovy, sardine and mackerel (2 species) (HAND);
 - red abalone, snails (7 species), limpets (2 species), clams (12 species), mussels, oysters, scallops, red and purple sea urchin (HAND);


Seaward boundary is east side of the highway 1 bridge and MPA extends inland to the State Parks boundary.

 - Pacific lamprey (SPEARFISHING OR BOW AND ARROW);
